Dear Friends.

This has been a good year at Forman Christian College (FCC)! So many things are trending upward; admission merit level, an increasing number of students, more Christian and minority students, new subjects and courses of study approved and we ended our fiscal year in the black again. These are the usual things that I put into reports, and they are important because the numbers must be right or we cannot keep the university open. What gives a beating heart to these statistics are the real lives of students, faculty and staff, many of whom have interesting stories about how FCC has been a transforming influence for them.

At Forman, we have a swimming pool. Despite the heat of Lahore, there are precious few pools. Ours is well used by our students and community, other Universities, and the public. One girl, a rising sophomore, had been coming with her mother for early morning swimming for years. She joined the University last year because of the pool. In an all-Pakistan women's swimming event held in Karachi, she won 27 medals, 9 of them gold (including the team medals for relays). She and her parents attended an event celebrating sports achievements and I was seated next to her father for the meal. What started as a passion for excellence in swimming became a life-changing experience, and they are thrilled with her FCC education.

Another example is a Christian boy from a remote village who was sent by his parents to Lahore to enroll at FCC. He had just \$60 in his pocket, all his family could scrape together. Four and a half years later, he told his story at a graduation celebration for Christian students. He graduated on schedule without debt, thanks to the scholarship program for worthy but needy students and work-study. As a Mass Communications major, he already had a job with a leading newspaper in town, but his strongest words of praise were for the leaders of the Christian Life program, where he learned about his faith and his life was transformed.

There are so many more stories that I could tell but these are two examples of a current student and a recent graduate, one a Muslim and one a Christian. Both have been changed by their studies at Forman Christian College. These stories can be multiplied 1,000-fold and are possible because of your prayers and support.



There are two questions I am most often asked by students when I talk with them at Forman Christian College. The first is "why did you come here?" The simple answer is that God sent us, and many others. It is very easy to see that God is blessing Forman in many special ways.

My wife, Marianne, and I made our first trip to Forman (and to Pakistan) in June 2005. We began teaching there in the Spring 2006 semester. For the next ten years I taught economics in the School of Management each spring. Marianne taught speech in the Mass Communications department and transitioned to dramatic arts as an extracurricular activity, offering workshops in theatre, acting and oral interpretation of Scripture as well as continuing to produce and direct plays.

Thanks to exemplary leadership at FCC and our generous donors, we have seen many positive improvements in all areas of campus life since 2005. Our students arrive better prepared academically, today's faculty is highly qualified, many with terminal degrees, and the campus infrastructure improves with each passing month. As Americans living on campus we especially appreciate the latter - the electricity mostly stays on, providing internet and air conditioning in our homes


and classrooms, making it more comfortable to teach, learn and live. Increased security measures provide a reasonably safe environment. These things we take for granted in the West all add up to an environment where students can forget what goes on outside the campus walls and immerse themselves in their studies. Campus life is now very vibrant, both socially and academically.

The second question is "how do you save or fix Pakistan?" My answer then as now is "one student at a time." In 2009, we had our first class of graduates from the denationalized era. These alumni are approximately 30 years of age now and are beginning to hold positions of importance in their chosen fields. More than a few are making major contributions as members of the staff of FCC. Positive change is a slow process, but clearly change is happening and it gives me great satisfaction to see it. Thanks to you, the foundations, churches and individuals who continue to support Forman Christian College, we are making our way toward a more peaceful future in Pakistan. You have everything to do with this progress, and the gratitude we feel for your support of this mission knows no bounds.



CAMPUS HIGHLIGHTS

MERCY HEALTH **CENTER EXPANSION**

One of the many unique opportunities available to all in the FCC community is the on-campus Mercy Health Center. Opened in 2014, the need quickly





LIGHT OF HOPE SCHOOL EXPANSION

Thanks to a generous grant from Intervarsity's Urbana 15 and gifts from numerous churches and individuals, the Light of Hope school building was completed this year, standing three stories tall. Many of the furnishings on the

first and second floor were provided through two grants from the Independent Presbyterian Church Foundation.

Opened in 2015 to serve the children of the poorest staff at FCC, the school was an immediate success. The first year they were at maximum capacity (180 students in grades K-5) using only the first floor. By November 2016, classrooms grew into the second floor, expanding classes to K-6, serving 242 students. Going forward, an upper class will be added each year, topping out in 2020 with the 10th grade. In April

2017, Light of Hope was chosen as a Model School for all of the Punjab, after being "adopted" by an US NGO supporting quality education through sustained use of technology and digital facilities. This NGO provided colorful, appropriate computer labs perfect for the younger students at Light of Hope.



COMMENCEMENT NOVEMBER 2016

In the U.S., we think of the graduation ceremony as synonymous with May or June. At FCC, commencement is held in November. In 2016, there were 673 Baccalaureate degrees and 155 Masters/MPhil degrees conferred. Of those numbers. 74 of the Baccalaureate and 12 of the Masters/MPhil degrees were to Christians. Commencement is a day of great excitement, held under an enormous tent seating 2,500+, with students, family members, faculty and local dignitaries in attendance.

Dr. Jim Tebbe, College Rector, says it is his favorite day of the year because he

> sees the pride in the faces of the parents, and knows each graduating class brings transformational change to these families and to future generations to come.



HOSTEL RENOVATIONS

Major renovations to the 1940s-era hostels continued this year. There are six oncampus hostels used to house male students at FCC. To date, renovations are now completed for Shirazi. West. Griswold and Velte Halls. Of the remaining two, Kennedy Hall is now under way, leaving only Newton for later this year. We are actively fundraising for these projects. Prior to renovations. FCC could house 576 male students. When

all six are complete, this number will rise to 827, an increase of 43%. Each renovated hostel will hold between 134 and 141 students.






FCC's focus on education for all is what inspires everyone. Every student, regardless of their religion, background or gender, gets equal opportunities and facilities.
