The emergence of the latest variant of COVID-19 combined with road closures due to Pakistan's Super League cricket matches at Gaddafi Stadium forced Forman to return to online instruction for the remainder of the fall 2021 semester. However, the campus has remained open and the sight of ongoing cricket matches in Forman's "front lawn" has been one of the early highlights of this year for me. As for Forman's outstanding college cricket team, it topped its group in the recent Central Punjab College Cricket League championships, going undefeated in three successive group matches against

Government MAO College, Concordia College, and Shalimar before finally losing in the semi-finals.

Also on the sports front, FCCU's tennis team achieved third place in the Lahore Board's Inter-Collegiate Tennis Championship for 2021-2022, held at Government College University (GCU) on December 17.

FCCU student Hanzala Ahmad -- who is also Executive Vice President of Forman's Debating Society -- won the Bronze Medal in the HEC Interschool Kamyab Jawan Gala Boxing Championship for 2021. When I congratulated Hanzala for his strong performance, he thanked FCCU Boxing Coach Abdul Ghaffar for

support as well as Mr. Shezad from the FCCU Sports Office staff for standing in his corner during the semi-final match.

As for student success, Aasia Khanum who heads Forman's Computer Science Department reports that the FCCU Computer Science student team is included among the regional winners of the Microsoft Imagine Cup Epic Challenge for 2022, qualifying for the World Finals in May 2022. The team includes MS Computer Science student Mehr-un-Nisa Kitchlew and BS Computer Science students Shahreyar Arif Kitchlew, Hamza Asaad, and Ahmed Saad. Their project focused on using Artificial Intelligence to detect breast cancer. The Imagine Cup initiative was

launched two decades ago to encourage student innovators while also developing their technical skills.
