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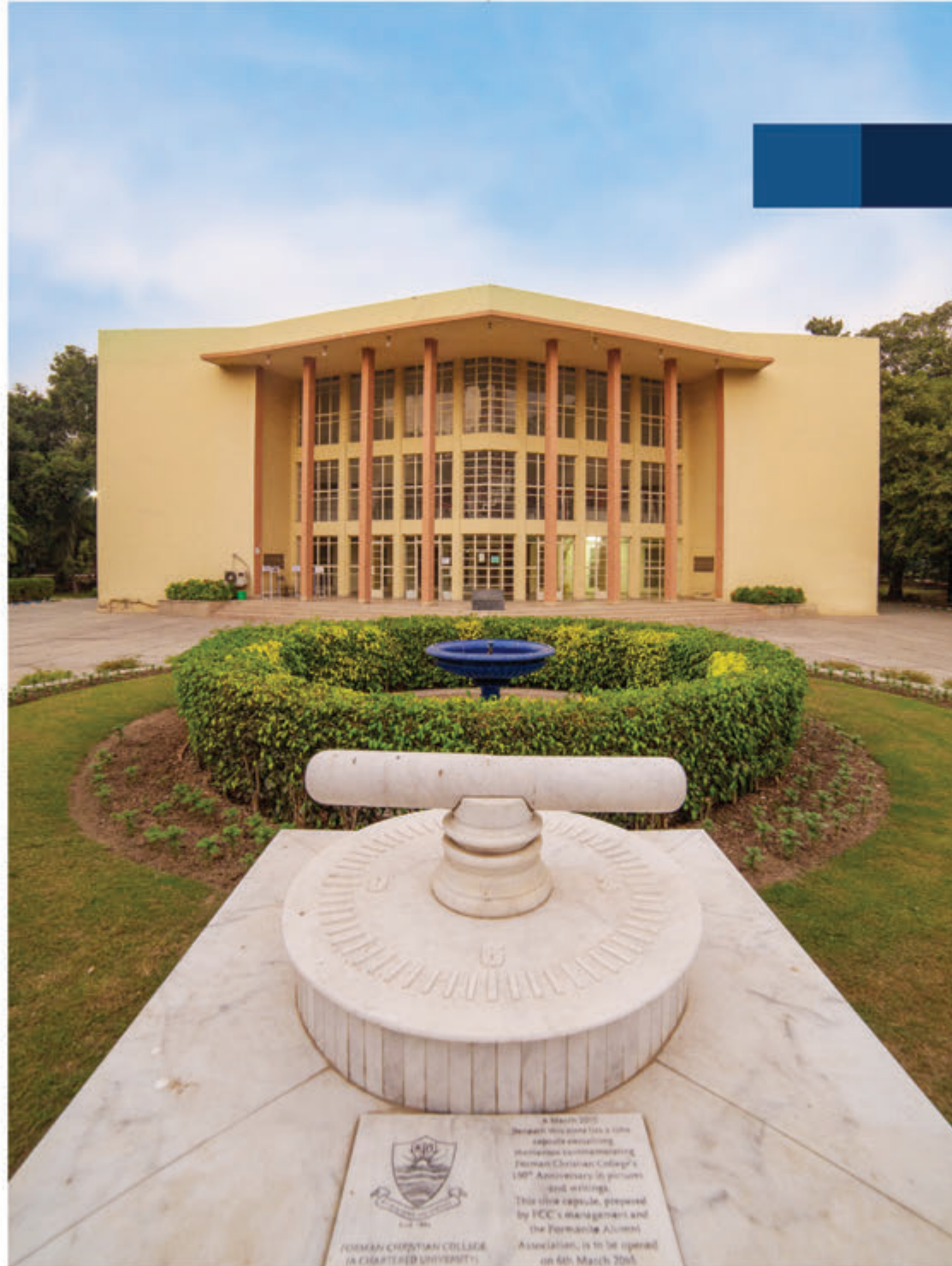

Introduction to FCCU

Forman Christian College (A Chartered University), a private, not-for-profit educational institution, was established in 1864. Academic excellence and the preparation of leaders who understand the value of service have been the hallmarks of education at the institution since its inception. One of the premier colleges in the subcontinent, FCCU has distinguished itself through its



remarkable graduates and the achievements of its faculty. It has built a reputation for providing outstanding education with innovation and pioneering work in its curriculum, admissions policies, range of extracurricular activities, and the rigor of its academic programs.

FCCU is an HEC-recognized, W-category university. It currently has over 7,000 students, 220 full-time faculty members with over 100 PhDs, and over 21,700 registered alumni. The University is divided into the Intermediate and University sections. The University offers Baccalaureate (Hons) and Postgraduate programs. The 4-year Baccalaureate (Hons) program, started in 2005, offers an American style, world-class liberal arts education at tuitions that are affordable. New postgraduate programs started with the MBA in 2007, and now include PhD, MPhil, Masters and Executive education in specific disciplines. The Intermediate program remains a notable strength. FCCU's generous financial aid program and scholarships for deserving students make high quality education readily accessible.

Mission

The mission of Forman Christian College (A Chartered University) is to impart, create and disseminate knowledge and to develop informed, ethical and responsible citizens who are prepared and committed to learn, lead and serve; persons who exemplify the FCCU motto, "By love serve one another".

Vision

The vision of FCCU is to be recognized as one of the very best educational institutions in the entire subcontinent. This is in keeping with the distinguished reputation established during the first century in its life.

Goals

The educational programs and the faculty approach to teaching are designed to graduate: Empowered learners with strong written, oral and quantitative skills that they can use to evaluate a constant flood of information. The idea is to create in them the ability to think independently and critically, solve problems and continue a lifetime of self-directed learning.

Informed learners who understand global and cross-cultural relationships, value the philosophy and history underlying the nation of Pakistan, and are fluent in both their native language and English.

Responsible learners who understand the ethical consequences of actions and are well groomed to be active citizens who accept their public duty and participate in the decision-making process of a democracy.

Brief History

Forman Christian College (A Chartered University) was founded in 1864 by Dr Charles W Forman, a Presbyterian missionary from the USA. The college was initially known as the Lahore Mission College, but in 1894 the name was officially changed to Forman Christian College in honor of the founder. In the early years, degrees were awarded through the Calcutta University. College level instruction was interrupted in 1869 due to the illness of key faculty members. College classes resumed in 1886, with degrees being awarded through the University of the Punjab. In 2004, FCC became a chartered university and from 2009 onwards has awarded its own degrees.

The early years of the college were marked by rapid growth in enrollment, and a constant struggle to find enough space to house the growing college. Enrollment grew from 18 students in 1886 to 130 in 1890, 311 in 1900, 426 in 1910 and 600 in 1915. Enrollment had reached 1,500 students by the time the

college was nationalized in 1972. Enrollment stands at over 7,000 students today.

The campus was located in the Anarkali (Nila Gumbad) area of Lahore for many years. Four major buildings were constructed by the college on that campus by 1916, and Ewing Hall, built in 1916, is still used as a hostel. In 1940 the college moved to its present spacious campus of over 100 acres on the scenic banks of Lahore Canal.

FCC has been served by a large number of distinguished educational leaders and teachers throughout its history. Dr CW Forman, Dr Sir JCR Ewing, Dr CH Rice, Dr ED Lucas, Dr SK Dutta, Dr HC Velte, Dr JH Orbison, Nobel Laureate Dr Arthur Compton, Maulvi Muhammad Bakar, Dr HD Griswold, Prof JM Benade, Shamsul Ulema Maulavi Muhammad Hussain, Dr KC Chatterji, Dr P Carter Speers, Dr SL Sheets, Prof MS Bhatti, Maulana Farzand Ali, Dr RH Ewing, Dr EJ Sinclair, Dr Robert F Teppe and Dr Carl Wheelless are among many who have impacted the lives of students and shaped the future of the college through the years. Under their leadership, the college became widely regarded as one of the very best in the entire subcontinent.

For many decades, FCCU has been widely recognized for its meritorious work of nurturing and consolidating the social and intellectual capital of Pakistan. Its motto, "By love serve one another," has been a guiding principle for Formanites throughout its history. Among its graduates are two Presidents of Pakistan, a Prime Minister of India, the first Chief Justice of Pakistan, a number of Governors and Chief Ministers of the Punjab and other provinces, an Attorney General of Pakistan, two Foreign Ministers of Pakistan, a President of the Security Council of the United Nations, numerous Ambassadors to other nations, a Chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission, a Chairman of the Senate, several Speakers of the National Assembly, numerous Generals and Admirals and an equally impressive list of leaders in the fields of education, law, medicine, arts and entertainment.

FCCU has been a leader for the development of curriculum among the universities of Pakistan. Through the years the college introduced into the curriculum such subjects as the Sciences, Economics, Psychology, Geography, Technical Chemistry and Sociology. FCCU is the first college in the subcontinent in whose laboratories research work of Nobel Prize caliber was conducted and Dr Arthur Compton received the Nobel Prize in 1932 for research conducted, in a large part, at FCC. In 1902, the college was the first college in the Punjab to admit women. FCCU also has a distinguished record of performing service for the nation. At the time of independence, the college converted two hostels into a hospital for refugees seeking medical assistance and thus began United Christian Hospital.

In 1972 the college was nationalized by the government. It was returned to the present owners of the college on 19 March 2003. In March 2004, the government granted university status to FCC. The University embarked upon an exciting new stage in its

history in September 2005 when it began a four-year Baccalaureate (Honors) program designed in accordance with world-class standards for accreditation.

Campus

Forman Christian College (A Chartered University) has an impressive and well-maintained campus with all the facilities needed to create an environment that is truly academic and conducive to purposeful learning. Centrally located in a beautiful residential area of Lahore, the campus sprawls over 108 acres along the left bank of the canal. The Business and Social Sciences Building houses the Social Science disciplines including the Departments of Business, Management and Economics. The Sir Anwar Pervaiz Social Sciences Block (situated in the Business and Social Sciences Building) was inaugurated in October 2016 and has added increased classroom space, faculty offices, meeting rooms and smart classrooms to the existing building. The Armacost Science Building is a modern state-of-the-art science building for the Departments of Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Physics and Computer Studies/Information Technology. It was inaugurated in February 2010. The Ahmad Saeed Administration Building houses the University's administrative departments.

The Canteen offers a setting for students to relax between classes. Basketball courts, a gymnasium, badminton and table tennis facilities are located in Lucas Center as are the offices of the Health and Physical Education Department. A new cafeteria for faculty and staff is also housed in the Lucas Center.

Sinclair Hall houses the largest auditorium - seating 740 people - of the University. This is where major events including the annual play, Christmas pageant, etc. are held. FCCU has a large sports ground in the center of campus that includes facilities for cricket, football and hockey plus a 400-meter oval shaped running track. A modern 25-meter swimming pool and six tennis courts are also located on campus.

Six student hostels are located on campus and an additional hostel, Ewing Hall, is located in the Anarkali (Nila Gumbad) area of Lahore. The hostels located on campus are Griswold, Kennedy, Newton, Vette, West and Shirazi Hall for male students and Hope Tower for female students. Each of the men's hostels provides rooms for approximately 90 students plus a common room and a mess hall. Almost all of the student rooms are single cubicles for only one student, but they are arranged so that three rooms share a verandah. Shirazi Hall provides accommodation for approximately 140 male students while Hope Tower has space for over 360 female students.

Learning is not restricted to the classrooms and many of the most important lessons learned during the University years are learned through participation in co-curricular and sports programs. FCCU offers a great variety of programs that provide opportunities for students to participate in activities that contribute to their learning and enjoyment.

Dr James A Tebbe was born and raised in Pakistan. As the son of a college professor and later Principal he developed a lifelong interest in education in Pakistan and Pakistani Islam. He gained fluency in Urdu language and learned about Pakistani higher education from within as an MA student in Punjab University in 1980. Unable to complete his degree due to the civil unrest in the country he went on to Princeton University for its completion in 1984. After completing his Master's degree from Princeton University, which focused on modern Islamic institutions; he did a thesis on the subject of higher education and Islamic self-identity in Pakistan. He got a PhD in Religious Studies from St John's Nottingham/Open University in 1997.

Dr Tebbe has thirty years of experience through service in cross-cultural non-government organizations with complex partnering relationships with national leadership and international teams in more than 25 countries in the Middle East, South Asia and East Asia. He has been serving as the President of Friends of Forman Christian College since 2010 where he has led fundraising and personal support efforts for the advancement of FCCU in the USA and Canada. He was appointed as the Executive Vice Rector/Acting Chief Academic Officer in August, 2011, and Rector of Forman Christian College (A Chartered University) in July, 2012. Dr Michael Murphy

Archbishop Sebastian Francis Shaw

Archbishop Sebastian Francis Shaw OFM was born in Padri Jo Goth, Sindh, Pakistan on 14 November 1957. He received his early education at Fatima High School and attended the Government Degree College. He received his religious training under the Order of Friars Minor and at the Christ the King seminary in Karachi and was ordained a priest in Lahore, Pakistan on 6 December 1991. Before joining the Franciscans he was a teacher.

He was rector of the Juniorate and Postulancy of Darul Naim in Lahore from 1991 to 1995, and taught at St. Mary's Minor Seminary, Lahore. He had also been Provincial of the Order of Friars Minor in Pakistan.

On 14 February 2009 he was appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Lahore by Pope Benedict XVI. Bishop Shaw holds a Master of Science degree in Guidance and Counseling from De La Salle University in Manila.

Bishop Shaw was consecrated as Bishop at Sacred Heart Cathedral, Lahore, on 25 April 2009. The principal celebrant was the Archbishop of Lahore Lawrence Saldanha, who was assisted by Most Rev Max John Rodriguez, Bishop of Hyderabad and Most Rev Joseph Couits, then Bishop of Faisalabad.

On 27 October 2013 Pope Francis appointed Shaw as a member of the Pontifical Council for Interreligious Dialogue. On 14 November 2013, Pope Francis appointed Bishop Shaw as Archbishop of Lahore.



Dr Gary Van Brocklin

Dr Gary Van Brocklin was born in Honolulu, Hawaii and spent 20 years as a missionary in South America. He holds degrees from Stanford and Fuller Seminary and is currently serving as the Regional Liaison for South Asia with the Presbyterian World Mission and serves on the FCCU board.

Rt Rev Irfan Jamil, Bishop of Lahore

Rt Rev Irfan Jamil graduated from Forman Christian College (A Chartered University) with BA (in Arts) and has a Masters in Political Science from Punjab University. He did his Bachelors in Theology from Gujranwala Theological Seminary (Pakistan) and studied at London Bible College (UK), Masters in Divinity from Trinity Theological College (Singapore).

Rt Rev Irfan Jamil has taught in various Bible Colleges, Church history, Pastoral Counseling, Worship and Liturgy, Discipleship and Counseling. He has written more than 15 papers on Mission and Evangelism, Peace Building and Inter-Faith Harmony, some are published in national magazines and books; a course on Christian Education for schools of Lahore Diocesan Board of Education. At present he is writing a course on confirmation, also on discipleship. He served Pakistan Fellowship of Evangelical Students for 23 years, six years as a staff and 17 years as General Secretary, serving as Chairman of the national board of Pakistan Fellowship of Evangelical Students; served on the Board of International Fellowship of Evangelical Students as Vice President for South East Asia; served as Vicar St Andrew's Church Lahore and St Thomas Church Islamabad. He has spoken at various national and international conferences/seminars and has trained counselors and Sunday school teachers at various levels. Served as interpreter for speakers from English to Urdu in our national conferences. He has been the best debater in FC College in both English and Urdu.

Prof Dr Ruksana David

Prof Dr Ruksana David is currently posted as Principal of Kinnaird College for Women Lahore, one of the oldest and most eminent educational institutions for women in Pakistan. She was born in 1952 in Lahore, Punjab and received her early education from Presentation Convent and from Kinnaird College for Women, Lahore. She then joined the University of the Punjab and did her BFA and MFA in Design and received a gold medal for securing first position. She was inducted immediately as faculty and taught at her alma mater for four years.

Subsequently, in collaboration with her husband, an eminent painter and professor at National College of Arts, Lahore, she established a design consultancy firm. She joined Kinnaird College for Women in 2001 as Head of the Fine Arts Department and launched a four-year degree program in Fine Arts and Design. She received her PhD in History of Art from Lahore College for Women University in 2009 and was posted Principal of Kinnaird College for Women in 2010.

During the past six years she has received Leadership Training at Harvard Graduate School of Education, Rausing Executive Development Center LUMS, Franklin Covey Pakistan and from Higher Education Department, Glasgow UK, sponsored by HEC and British Council. She has been nominated as member of various boards and syndicates of higher education institutions in Lahore. As member of the Board of Directors at FCCU, she feels by being head of an institution she brings with her not only the understanding of the working of a higher education institution but also the ability to identify areas that require focus in the larger context of an educational institution that is not mainstream.

Dr Nayer Fardows has a PhD in International Relations from PIMSAT Karachi, MPhil, LL.M and Masters in International Relations from Karachi University, Masters in Administrative Sciences and Masters in Political Science from the Punjab University.

Besides that he is professionally qualified in Project Management from LUMS, has a diploma in Information Technology from COMSAT, Educational Auditors Course from National University of Sciences and Technology (NUST), Islamabad, Leadership Course from Haggai Institute, Maui USA, English Language Course from USA, Lead Auditor Course from Moody International, UK, Teaching Learning Environment Course from Barcelona, Spain, Educational Technologies Course from Samos, Greece, E-Learning Technologies Course from Madrid, Spain, Assessment and Evaluation Course from Italy, Outcome Based Assessment Course from Paris and Reflective Teaching Course from Honolulu, USA.

Dr Nayer has more than 32 years of educational experience, serving in various positions in top educational institutes of Pakistan, such as Director General Education, Chairman Armed Forces Board of Higher Education, Dean of BMAS degree program, National University of Sciences and Technology (NUST), Director of Studies Pakistan Military Academy (PMA) Kakul, Director Research National Defense University, Islamabad, Director Colleges of Federal Government Educational Institutes (FGEIs), Director of Studies, Army Burn Hall College for Boys Abbottabad, Director Studies Army Public College Abbottabad, Director of Studies Army Burn Hall College for Girls Abbottabad, Controller of Examinations, Director Special Education, Pakistan Army and Director Technical Training Institutes.

Dr Nayer is a visiting professor at 20 national and international universities. Furthermore, he has produced 70 books as author, chief editor and editor and has also presented/published twenty papers in different international conferences/publications. He has been the editor of two international standard journals – NDU Journal and Margalla Papers. He is also a member of Board of Governors of nine different prestigious institutions, President of two Finance Committees, President of three Executive Committees and member of three Academic Councils. Mr Edgar Pace joined the FCCU Board in 2014 as a representative of Presbyterian Church of Pakistan at the invitation of FCCU Rector Dr James Tebbe. At an early stage after its denationalization he had been in association with FCCU through some of the senior faculty staff who were working for its development and growth. His own educational career and experience in Gordon College, Rawalpindi and Christian Training Institute (CTI) Sialkot had always been an inspiration for him to see FCCU and other similar institutes to be alive once again and serve the community. He respects and admires the continuing efforts of the Rector, Board and the faculty right from the beginning for its success and growth.

Rt Rev Dr Alexander John Malik, Bishop Emeritus

Born on October 1, 1944, in Martinpur, District Sheikhupura, Rt Rev Dr Alexander John Malik is the longest-serving Bishop in the history of the Anglican Church of the Subcontinent.

After graduating from Punjab University, Lahore, Bishop Malik got his diploma from Bishop's College Calcutta and degree of Bachelor of Divinity from Serampur University, India. He got his Master's degree from McGill University, Canada, and his Doctorate of Divinity from Wheaton College, USA. While studying at the Islamic Research Center in McGill University, he worked on his PhD thesis based on the life of Prophet Muhammad (PBUH).

Bishop Malik is a strong advocate of a mission to unite Pakistan under the flag of compassion and interfaith harmony. Realizing the need to create interfaith harmony, he established Lahore Diocesan Interfaith Forum that conducts seminars and conferences. He vociferously speaks up for Christians as an integral part of Pakistan's identity. Bishop Malik was named as a person of international achievement by International Biographical Centre of Cambridge in 1991. Church of Pakistan Lahore Diocese (COPLD) has honored Bishop Malik with the title of Emeritus Bishop of Lahore.

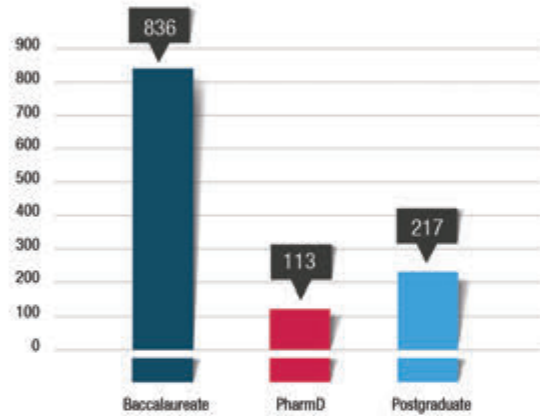

Enrollment

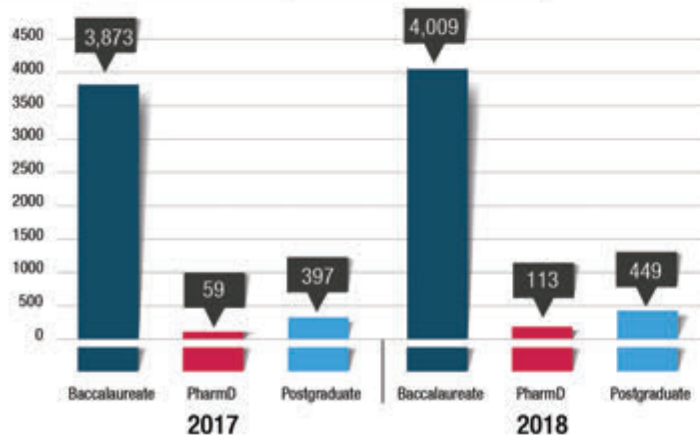

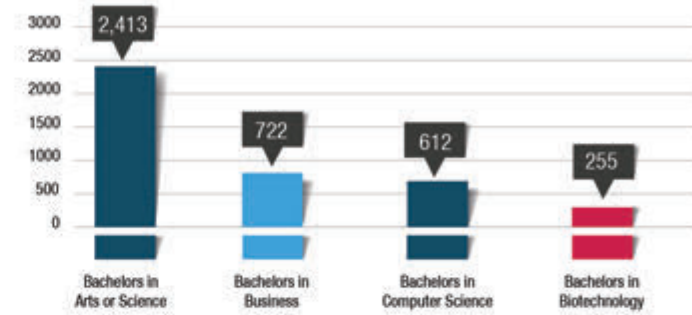


Total University Enrollment

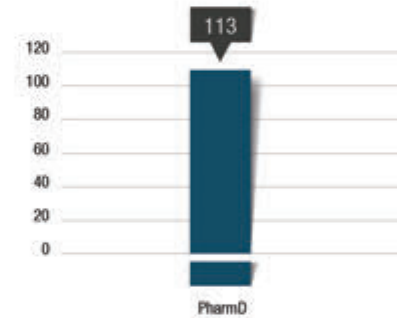


Minority Enrollment in 2018

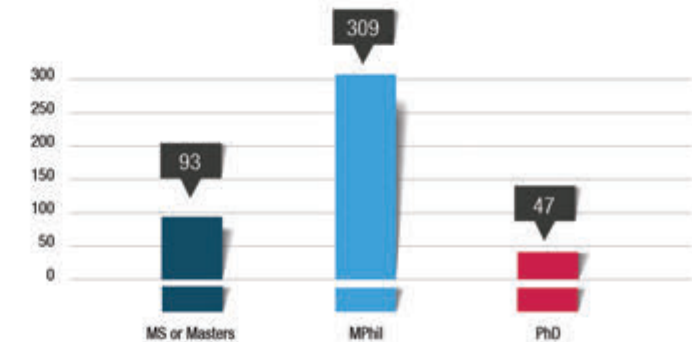
Baccalaureate Enrollment



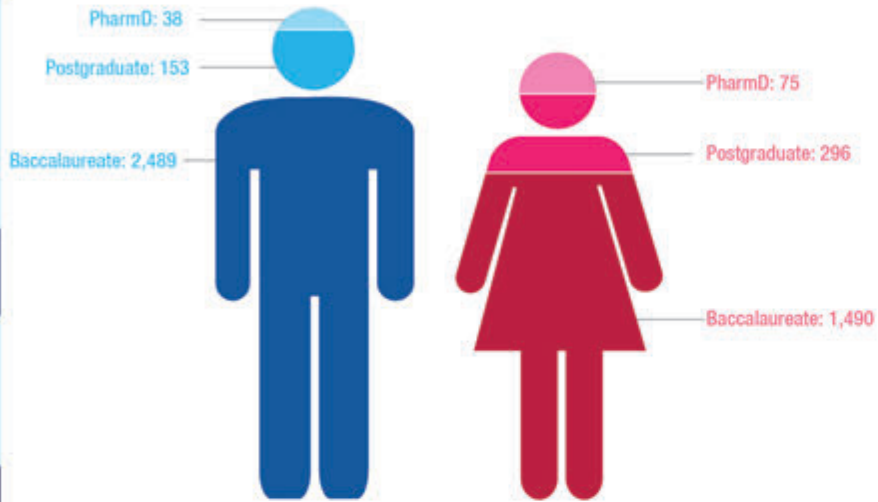
PharmD Enrollment



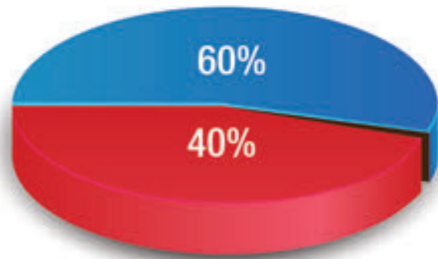
Postgraduate Enrollment



University Gender Ratio

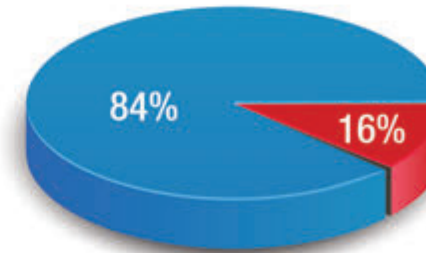


Faculty Gender Ratio



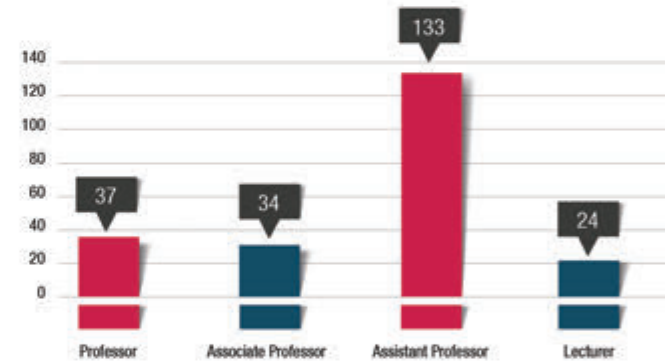

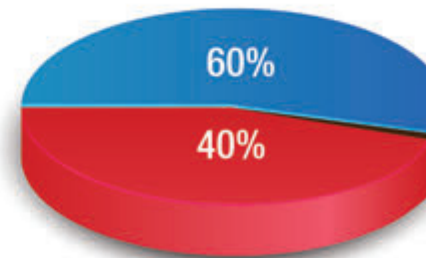

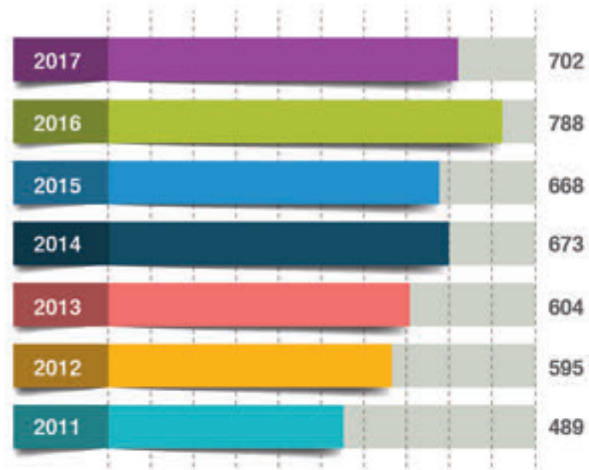

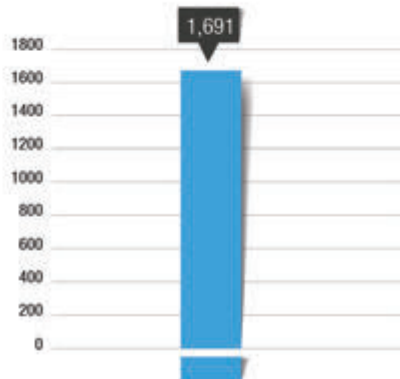

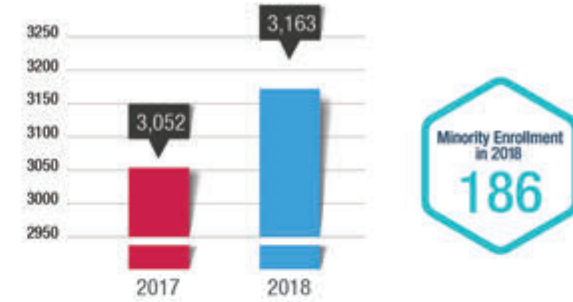

Enrollment in the Intermediate program stood at 1,691, bringing the total enrollment to 3,163

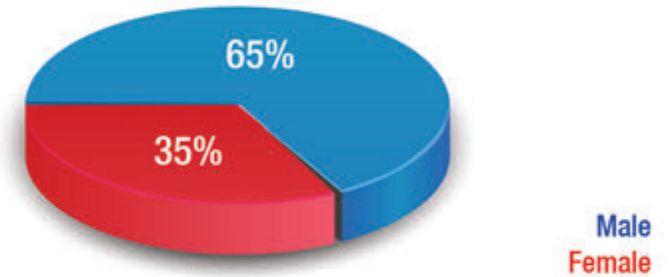
Newly Admitted Students



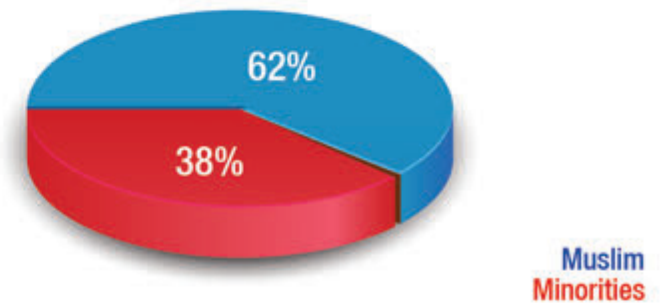
Total Enrollment



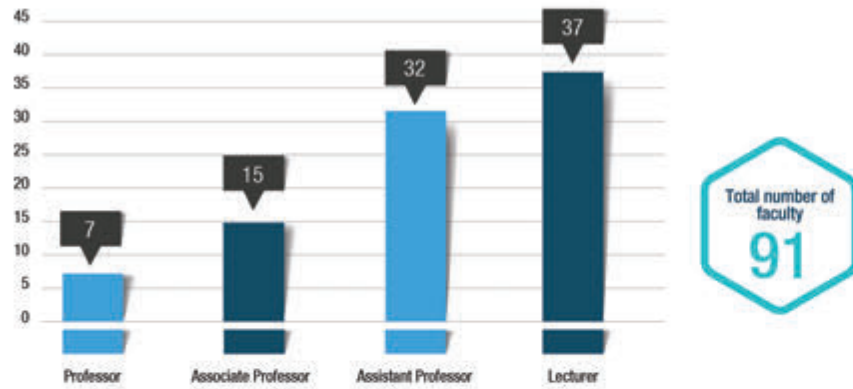
Faculty Gender Ratio
